Subject: Pine Damaged Timber

Due to drought conditions, pine trees in our area have started displaying signs of mortality. Upon inspection, the trees are showing signs of insect, southern pine beetle, damage in many of the high use areas on

PRVWSD property. I conducted a visual tree inspection, and followed it up with an actual damaged tree count, by area. Evaluation of the areas are based on current actual number and a projected final number, based on 30% anticipated spread rate.

The collected data is as follows:

I am currently pursuing estimates for the removal of the diseased timber. Two options are available. Option one, have the timber removed by a tree service. Option two, find a logging operation to remove the timber.


Option one, quicker, more efficient on the cleanup, and they assume the liability of damage. Option two, if available, treat the areas as a timber sale. Disadvantages of this option, no value to the harvested timber, bug damaged wood not accepted at most mill locations, not as clean of a site when finished, use of heavy equipment, which can cause rutting, damage to the asphalt surrounding the harvest areas, power line damage and the need to exclude pedestrians during the harvest. Option two could be more cost efficient per application but could not be used in Timberlake Campground.

I have obtained a quote from Morgan Tree Service to harvest the pine bug infested trees in Timberlake campground, Bobby Cleveland Park, Pelahatchie Shore Park, and Old Trace for a total of \$100,000.00. This will include the harvest and removal of the bug pine timber but not grinding of the stumps in the four facilities listed.

It is my recommendation to pursue option one. To allow Morgan Brothers Tree Service to remove the pine bug wood timber in the four facilities listed above.


